Sexual Exploitation In Rotherham

Definition

- Sexual Exploitation of a child or young person under 18 is abuse.
- ➤ The "sexual exploitation of children (and young people) consists of criminal practices that demean, degrade and threaten the physical and psychosocial integrity of children (and young people)"
- >Another party benefits through this exploitation in cash, goods or in kind.

What it isn't.

- >A trade, job, or industry.
- >A legitimate choice on the part of the child.
- >An act involving informed consent.

Who are the exploited?

- Children and young people, (as young as twelve in Rotherham).
- Usually children and young people who are vulnerable in some way.
- May have disinterested parents, are disengaged or excluded from school. Victims of bullying, family upheaval, abuse at home. Runaways, care leavers
- ➤ Low self esteem

How do they become involved?

- > Groomed by "pimps"
- > Grooming is the cynical, deliberate creation of an exploitative relationship.
- > A process that leads to the complete domination of the child or young person by the pimp.
- The child or young person becomes a commodity to be passed around and moved around.

What happens?

- > Completely detached from family and support networks
- > 55% use heroin at least once a week.
- > 40% have been raped.
- > 73% sexual health problems.
- > 33% have attempted suicide.
- ➤ Most have self harmed. (source. net) NSPCC

Does this happen in Rotherham?

- This is a national and regional problem. It is often part of a broader range of criminal activity involving theft, drugs, violence and firearms.
- Since January 2004, 41 girls and young women and 2 young men have been referred to the ACPC Sexual Exploitation Forum due to concerns about sexual exploitation.
- > The Risky Business project is currently working on a one to one basis with 96 girls and young women.

Who are the perpetrators?

- Lone perpetrators.
- > Perpetrators who are involved in various criminal activities.
- A family from the Asian community consisting of a number of brothers and their associates. These brothers are also involved in a number of taxi firms.
- > Some members of the Iraqui Kurd community.
- Source Sexual exploitation, drug use and drug dealing: the current situation in South Yorkshire – Angie Heal South Yorkshire Police

What are we doing in Rotherham?

- > ACPC Sexual Health Forum (Soon to come under the future Safeguarding Board).
- Partners from Social Services, South Yorkshire Police, Health, Education Welfare, Young Peoples Services – Risky Business, Bridges Project.
- > Risky Business project 1996, Reactive /proactive approaches.
- South Yorkshire Police are working in partnership with other agencies, closely with Risky Business, looking at intelligence and sharing information e.g. missing from home data, information re perpetrators, girls and young women.
